

# Children's Educational Opportunity Foundation of Connecticut, Inc. Measures of Success End of School Year Report: 2016-17 September 27, 2017

#### **Report Overview**

#### CEO Scholar Eligibility Requirements – 2016-17

- Students must reside in Bridgeport, Hartford or New Haven.
- Family household income cannot exceed 200 percent of the federal poverty guidelines.
- CEO families may choose any private accredited K-8 school in Connecticut.
- CEO provides half of the private school tuition to a maximum of \$2,100/year parents provide the balance.
- Students may enter CEO in grades K-5 and may be eligible to continue their scholarship until grade 8.
- Renewal students and their siblings are given preference for scholarship awards
- Scholarships are awarded on a first come / first served basis

#### Measures Used to Evaluate Performance Comparisons

- Comparisons between CEO Scholars <u>and</u> their public school peers:
  - <u>Standardized tests</u> in grades 3 through 8 in English Language Arts (ELA) and Math
  - CEO Scholars' <u>school grades</u> in ELA and Math are measured (public school comparisons not available)
  - CEO Scholars and their public school peers are tested in grades 3 through 8 for greater comparability.


#### **Results**


- CEO Scholars have higher achievement that their public school counterparts overall.
- CEO Scholars have significantly higher average achievement than their public school peers deemed "high needs."
- "High Needs" students come from low-income families, are English learners, or have disabilities.
- All CEO Scholars would be considered "high needs" if they attended public schools.
- CEO Scholars significantly outperform their public school peers in both English Language Arts and Math, particularly high needs students from disadvantaged socio-economic backgrounds.
- Public school fifth and seventh graders' math achievement is two-thirds lower than their CEO peers, all of whom would be considered high needs students.
- Such results suggest that CEO Scholars have a much more solid foundation as they head off to high school, which helps increase the likelihood that they will graduate rather than drop out.



# Combined CEO Scholars & Public School Students, Achievement Rates Compared

- CEO Scholars take standardized tests that report results as national percentile ranks (NPR).
- Percentiles range from the 1<sup>st</sup> to the 99<sup>th</sup> percentile, with the average set at the 50<sup>th</sup> percentile.
- Thus 55 means that students scored better than 55 percent of all test-takers nationwide.
- Public school students in Connecticut take the Smarter Balanced Assessment.
- Scores represent achievement levels ranging from 1 (standard not met) to 4 (exceeded standard).
- The public school scores below represent combined percentages of students scoring at Levels 3 (met standard) and 4 (exceeded standard).
- Thus 42 means that 42 percent of students scored at or above the grade-level subject standard.
- Combined average per-pupil spending by Bridgeport, Hartford, and New Haven public schools is more than three times higher than the combined average tuition of private schools enrolling CEO Scholars in those same cities.








Bridgeport CEO Scholars & Public School Students, Achievement Rates Compared

- The performance of Bridgeport CEO Scholars is notably higher than their public school peers in both ELA and Math across all grade levels.
- Average Bridgeport public school spending is more than twice the average tuition of private schools CEO Scholars attend.









Hartford: CEO Scholars & Public School Students, Achievement Compared, 2016-17

- The performance of Hartford CEO Scholars is higher than their public school peers in both ELA and Math across all grade levels
- Average Hartford public school spending is more than three and a half times higher than the average tuition of private schools CEO Scholars attend.









## New Haven CEO Scholars & Public School Students, Achievement Compared, 2016-17

- The performance of New Haven CEO Scholars is higher than their public school peers in both ELA and Math across all grades
- New Haven CEO Scholars in the eight-grade were not tested.
- Average New Haven public school spending is more than three and a half times higher than the average tuition of private schools CEO Scholars attend.









## **CEO Scholars' School Grades**

• CEO Scholars' school grades across subjects and grade levels are well above average, most in the mid- to high 80s, which is roughly equivalent to a letter grade of B or B+.

- Grades are presented as numbers according to the following general grading scale: A, 90-100; B, 80-89; C, 70-79; D, 60-69; and F, 59 and below.
- Grades for 321 CEO Scholars were provided: 123 from Bridgeport; 92 from Hartford; and 106 from New Haven.



## CEO Scholars with Standardized Test Scores by School and Grade Levels, 2016-17

- Private schools use a variety of standardized tests to measure student performance in ELA and math in most grades.
- 27 private schools attended by CEO Scholars administered standardized tests.
- 204 CEO Scholars were tested, and results were reported for 204 students (100%).
- CEO funding for students tested in 2016 totaled \$410,933 in scholarships averaging \$2,059 each.
- Tuition at private schools attended by these CEO Scholars averaged \$5,199.

## CEO Scholars with School Grades by School and Grade Levels, 2016-17

- Thirty private schools enrolling CEO Scholars issue grades based on a numerical scale.
- 322 CEO Scholars' grades in ELA and Math are reported. Tuition at these schools averaged \$5609
- CEO funding for students graded totaled \$645,453 in scholarships averaging \$2,065 each.
